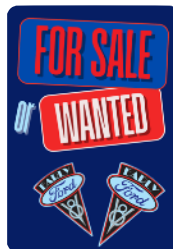

### 2025 Early Ford Club Christmas Party

Our club Christmas Party was held on December 7<sup>th</sup> and it seems we all had a great time.

We had some long-time members that we have not been seen in a while show up. Becky and Dave Swenson came and it was so good to see them. Tom and Alice Daily, Harvey Dunham, Lynne Lang and Lenny Bush were also in attendance. We haven't seen some of these people on a regular basis so we were very happy they were able to join us. I am sorry if I missed anyone but am trying to go on memory here.



It started off with a little confusion on our room as they changed it on us at the last minute. We all seemed to settle in fine though. BJ found a great DJ for us and he played some good music along with calling our drawing numbers for our white elephant exchange and our 50/50 raffle.

The evening starting off with happy hour and visiting. Dinner was then served and it was a very nice buffet of prime rib, salmon and chicken cordon bleu, along with salad, veggies and rice. Dessert was bite size pumpkin bread and lemon cream pie bites.



Sam presented the officers and board members that were in attendance with gifts of vests and hats. We did not let him off the hook though as we presented him with a very nice jacket and hat.

We then moved on to our white elephant gift exchange. There was some fun with some stealing of gifts. All in all, everyone had a great time and walked away with some very nice gifts.

We also collected food for the food banks in Washington and Idaho along with Toys for Tots. Gail and I split up

both the food and the toys. I took half of the food and toys. I delivered the food to Partners Inland Northwest which was formally the Spokane Valley Partners. They weighed the food and it came out to 40 pounds!

I also delivered about 15 toys to the Toys for Tots that is located at the Northtown Mall. As of Monday, the 8<sup>th</sup> they were at about 6,000 kids that they were giving toys to and that number was expected to grow. When I called to see where to take the toys, they said that they were getting low on toys. She also indicated that some money was coming through from some corporate donors and that would help. I know times are tough for a lot of people so they were very thankful for all they were getting. I did see quite a few people waiting in line for their numbers to be called so they could pick up toys for their kids. Last year they distributed 35,594 toys to 10,172 kids. As I talked to Shauna, she was able to take me into the area they use to put the toys together. This is a well-run organization and they are all volunteers only, no one is a paid employee. I was also able to take some pictures of the volunteers and the area they used to sort the toys. There are a couple of kids in the pictures that were volunteers and were busy putting together toys. There was even a gentleman that was helping that was 100 years old and he shows up every year! I always knew about Toys for Tots and have donated in the past, but I had no idea about everything they do. I may even donate some time next year.

Gail Whitman also had about 15 toys that she took 2/3 of the toys to the Coeur d' Alene Police Department for them to distribute. She took the remaining toys and the food (which she probably also had about 40 pounds) to Cup of Grace which is a faith-based nonprofit in Spirit Lake Idaho. They help families in need with food from a food bank and they also have lunches for kids in need on Saturdays. When Gail delivered the food and toys they were serving community members lunch. They have a food pantry, clothing closet, and diaper bank. They also provide "Buddy Bags" that can be carried in responder's vehicles to help kids that may be in some type of traumatic situation. 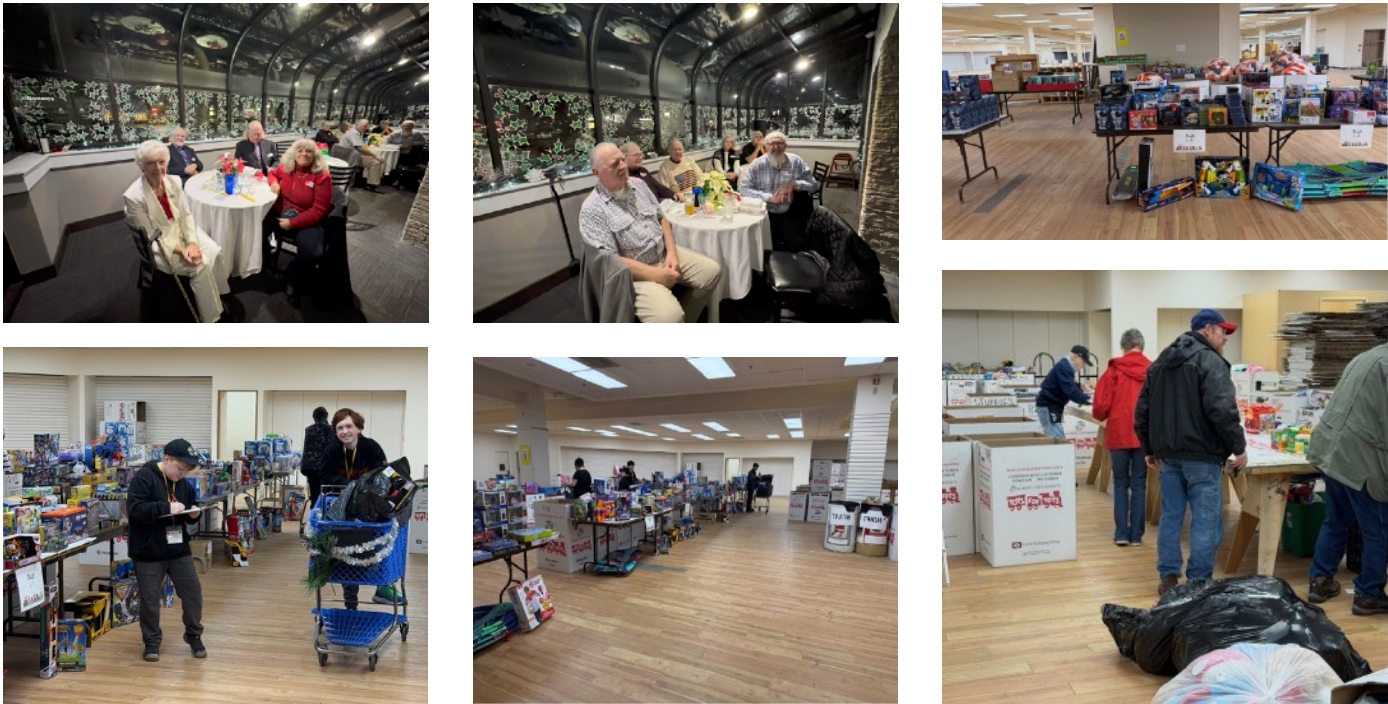
