Old Business:

501 (c) (3) status. The BOD met and went over the IRS form to bring the club back to a 501 (c) (3) status. The cost was \$275. After going over the form the BOD voted to move to pay the fee and file the form. Annette completed the form and filed it on August 20th. This will streamline our filing at the end of the year. This will allow us to be tax exempt so that we do not have to pay taxes on our annual gross receipts up to \$50,000 in the year or for our assets up to \$250,000. None of which we have since we no longer do the swap meet. People can also donate to us and can write the donation off and members can deduct their membership dues as a donation.

New Business:

Dues Increase: At the August meeting someone suggested that we raise the dues to help pay for some of

our tours. Bill Degnan asked the question, why do we want to raise the dues at this time if we have money in the bank? It was noted that we have about 63 members and some of those do not pay because they are Golden, Charter or Lifetime members. Our revenue from dues is \$600. By raising the dues, we would only make another \$300. Sam suggested that we hold off on this. BJ Hokanson moved that we hold off on this since we do have money in the bank right now. Ruth Kohlmeier 2nd. Motion passed.

Sam also brought up the subject of insurance for the club. This is with National so we get a great deal on this. It is \$140 for the year. It covers the officers and directors and members.
