Ritzville Tour: May 5th by Chuck McVey

Made coffee early Saturday morning, got the '41 out and started cleaning it.... guess what?... it started sprinkling. I thought, boy the day wasn't going to be like that. Moved the coupe back in the garage and finished cleaning it.

Don Leidel got to my place at 7:30 a.m. He rode with me because the Mercury is on the down side. We went and got donuts at Freddy's, didn't go to Mikes this time. When we came out of the store, it was sprinkling pretty good. I got out my big towels (I carry just for rain), wiped down the '41 again.

Members started showing up a little after 8:30 a.m. My '41, Bob & Annette Long's '36, Butch & B.J. Glander's '36 four door. Then Glen Terry & his friend showed up with his '35 ford pickup. Was great to see new faces in the tour. Other members on the tour were, Gary & JoAnn Davis, with a friend she worked with, in their '49 Ford fordor. Jim & Lee Adams with their '49 fordor. Dale Halverson, Jan Farnham and her sister Karen in their '33 Ford tudor. Chris Hughes and his '38 fordor. Ones that didn't drive old cars were George & Jackie Feldmiller and Art & Millie Howell. We got out of the Valley a little after 9:00 a.m. I told everyone that we had to drive I-90 as we needed to be at the Railroad Station by 10:30 a.m. The people were nice enough to open it for the V8 Club. Some of the members had never been at the station before, and some were there last year. In the hour we spent there, three trains came by doing all of whatever the speed limit is for trains. They don't slow down to wave.

From there, we went down on the main street of Ritzville. There was a lot of parking. Sure enough, that part of Ritzville hasn't changed much in over a hundred years. The only things left there are about four buildings that are open to the public: the drug store, a bar 'n grill, and an old grocery store. Some person from the town reopened the bowling ally for the kids. The movie house has been updated to handle new movies. If a person wanted to have lunch, they would drive back to the first exit if going West on I-90 to the Ritz or one of the drive-ins there.

How Ritzville got it's name. The first settler was a man called William McKay in 1880. Phillip Ritz settled there two years earlier. He named the nearby railway station Ritzville and the town took the name from there. He was a nurseryman and florist from Walla Walla territory.

We left Ritzville a little after noon. Traveled to Harrington and Highway 2. We were 15 minutes late getting to the Highway Café in Reardon. There were 20 people in all for lunch, the food was great. After lunch, we were headed for the train museum. Two cars didn't take in the museum. Had the old car drawing and Bob Long won the first drawing of the season.

At the Train Museum, it has changed some. New things have been added. One of the people there showed us what the place will look like in the future. I didn't get a picture of the layout, but it will be nice. The dining car has been up dated. The five cars next to the platform has most of the stuff working in them. One thing that has not been updated is the little train ride. It has gotten bad to ride on. Four of us sat in the back car. If your back side didn't hurt before getting on the train, it sure did when you got off. The tracks have settled and are uneven. The ride was faster last year.

A couple things that happen just before leaving the parking lot at Fred Meyers... I told everyone we were driving I-90 to Ritzville. Well somehow we got strung out and when the back cars got to Highway 2 exit, they turned off there. Thank God for cell phones. We all got to Ritzville okay.

The other, is that I made the mistake of not leaving earlier. We had one old car turn back, because the driver didn't want to drive the freeway that far. No names, but I do apologize for that.

It was a good tour, loved everyone that came on the tour. I think everybody had fun. Lots of laughter and good friendship.

The scholarship committee announced that fifteen scholarships will be offered. There were 46 applications accepted for this year with each scholarship being in the amount of \$1,500.




