Hello EFV-8 Region #23,


Hoping you are all enjoying the summer. We have had a nice start


daughter and son-in-law for inviting our club to their cabin for this event.



Between 1914 and 1924, they toured the Eastern U.S. in Ford automobiles on well-publicized camping trips. When Edison died, his son gave Ford a test tube that contained Edison's "last breath."


