Well summer is gone and fall blew in forcefully. Hope you have your coats and sweaters handy, we need them.


I want to thank the club and all my friends for the cards and flowers. The flowers still look beautiful. I am feeling much better

Today, as the premier Marquee Club of our represented vehicles with membership of over 9000 and 125 active Regional Groups worldwide, we are dedicated to the restoration and preservation of all Ford Motor Company vehicles, 1932 through 1953.

The club's award winning bi-monthly magazine, THE V-8 TIMES, is circulated all over the world and is acclaimed as one of the best car club magazines anywhere. The V-8 TIMES features technical articles, shop tips, questions and answers by our panel of experts, nostalgia, club and regional group news, offerings of accessories and restoration manuals found nowhere else - plus classified ads on cars and parts. 
Swap Meet Meeting
