



It is with great sadness that we let you know Art Howell passed away on March 12, 2021 Art was a long time member of our club and his kindness, friendly smile and friendship will truly be missed. The following is taken in part from Art's obituary from <u>legacy.com</u>.

Arthur "Art" Louis Howell was born October 31, 1937 in Seattle, WA to Floyd and Patricia Howell. He passed away peacefully at the hospital after surgery complications on March 12, 2021. The earth has lost a remarkable man and heaven has gained a shining star. Art was loved by everyone and never realized the impact of his life on those around him. His kind heart, warm smile, ability to listen and gift of gab were a few of his many gifts. He was never too busy to help or make time for anyone family, friends or the stranger he hadn't met yet. As a boy and young man, he

lived in many towns in Washington, moving for his dad's work on the dams. Art graduated from Metaline Falls, WA and joined the Army in July 1960, serving until July 1963. He had many jobs throughout the years, as well as being a business owner, and retired from the Spokesman Review in 2001 as a dock manager.

In 1982, he met Millie (Peterson), whom he married a few years later. Together they lived in their beautiful home in Otis Orchards for over two decades with the door always open for family and friends. They enjoyed fishing and traveling in their motorhome. It wasn't unusual for Art to disappear for hours on those trips getting to know others. He enjoyed time in his shop working on cars, tinkering, and chatting with drop in visitors. Art and Millie also enjoyed the gatherings and road trips with the Early Ford V8 Club members.

Art is preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his wife Millie, their children and a lot of grandchildren and great grandchildren. At Art's request, he will be laid to rest at the WA State Veterans Cemetery in Medical Lake with military honors.

Letter from the Zoom Meeting Annette Attended for President Chuck McVey

For those who attended, club officers and directors, thank you for your attendance last night at our first call to share information with RG presidents. We had a total of 42 attendees and I was amazed at how well the call progressed utilizing Zoom. There were very few challenges experienced by attendees logging on, no technical interruptions and a significant amount of information shared within the one-hour limit. It appeared all attendees felt comfortable and information was exchanged freely. Participant questions were very relevant and important to the group; to my knowledge all were answered appropriately.

As you could evidence, your club directors are very busy behind the scenes working to dig out from Covid by preparing a strategic plan, grow membership, stimulate RG activities and preparing plans to endorse RG gatherings where state and local laws allow them. Our staff attorney, the board and myself are working to develop an additional resolution to support RG activity under guidelines issued by individual states. My plans are to call a special meeting of the board, in the very near future, to reach agreement on how we will advise RG's to proceed with making plans for spring. Nationwide, Covid restrictions are beginning to change now with revised state guidelines, distribution of vaccines for immunity and we heard your input loud and clear last night. I anticipate having an answer to RG presidents no later than early last week.

Several of you requested copies of documents we discussed last night. Here is the <u>report from the Strategic Planning Team</u> made to the board 2/27/21 with the top three objectives highlighted in YELLOW, the focus for this year. Also the link to the <u>chart we reviewed</u> documenting our club's membership trend back to 2009.
